Graduate Scholarships

All applicants, U.S. and international, are automatically considered for CCS Scholarships upon completion of the admissions requirements. Awards are based on the portfolio review, academic achievement and the applicant's potential for success. If an applicant is awarded a CCS MFA Scholarship, the applicant will receive notification of this scholarship along with his/her acceptance letter. Recipients must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 to continue receiving these scholarships. Students receiving tuition assistance from their employer or country will not be eligible for these scholarships.

International Student Grant

New and returning International students are awarded \$1,500 in the first semester of enrollment each academic year.

International Students Cost of Attendance 2018 - 2019

Direct costs are those paid directly to CCS. Once direct costs are determined, you may also want to refer to other areas of this form for estimates of other indirect costs you may incur, most notably, books and supplies.

In order to receive an I-20, you must provide documentation of funds to cover one year's tuition and expenses.

If you will be joined by dependents, a spouse or children who will require CCS-sponsored F-2 visas, then you will have to demonstrate additional funds for your Statement of Financial Feasibility. If you will have F-2 dependents, please estimate an additional \$9,000 for your spouse and \$3,000 for each child.

Student Employment

Students studying full-time in the U.S. on an F-1 student visa are only eligible for certain types of on-campus employment. Employment on campus is limited to fewer than 20 hours per week during the semester, but you may work up to 40 hours per week during the annual vacation period. Work-study positions are updated regularly on the Financial Aid section of the CCS Blackboard site with application instructions.

TUITION PAYMENT OPTIONS

You may pay tuition and fees in full at the time of registration. Students may pay tuition and fees online, by mail or at the Cashier's Office.

You may choose to defer payment of tuition and fees. You must pay a minimum of \$100 at the time of registration. And then all tuition and fees must be paid in full by August 1 for the Fall semester and December 14 for the Winter semester.

Additionally, you may elect to use the ACI Interest-Free Monthly Payment Plan. The College for Creative Studies accepts tuition payments through ACI. ACI offers monthly interest-free payment plans as a way to pay the remainder of your tuition and fees. There is a \$65 semester enrollment fee for this option. ON-CAMPUS HOUSING OPTIONS AND COSTS

The following housing options are available to full-time College for Creative Studies students.

Loft-Style Units – Taubman Center: 2–4 students per unit; meal plan required

2-person room = \$3,000 per semester / \$6,000 per year

3-person room = \$2,950 per semester / \$5,900 per year

4-person room = \$2,950 per semester / \$5,900 per year

Apartment-Style Units – Art Centre Building: 1–6 students per unit; meal plan optional

1-person room = \$3,400 per semester / \$6,800 per year

2-person room = \$3,250 per semester / \$6,500 per year

4-person room = \$2,950 per semester / \$5,900 per year

6-person room = \$2,850 per semester / \$5,700 per year

Apartments – The Scott: 2–4 students per unit; meal plan optional

2-person room = \$3,600 per semester / \$7,200 per year

4-person room = \$3,350 per semester / \$6,700 per year
